

DAT – Dental Admission Test

- Big decision factor for schools
- Best if taken a month before the AADSAS open
- May be scheduled anytime during the long
- Scores are given at the end of the exam
- Scores are received by schools
- In 2023 the cost is \$525, timing ~4.5 hours

IMPORTANT!!!

- Select all schools when registering for the DAT
- Take/Pass the DAT a month or more before the AADSAS opens

How many times can you take the DAT? What is the retest policy?

The DAT retest policy is not subject to appeal and states that:

- Candidates must wait 60 days between testing attempts on the DAT, with a maximum of four (4) such
 administrations permitted during any 12-month period of time.
- Candidates with three (3) or more attempts on the DAT must apply for permission to test again, providing proof of recent application to dental school with each subsequent application to test.
- Subsequent to the candidate's fifth DAT attempt, the candidate may retest only once per 12-month period.







PAT - Top/Front/End Visualization (Section 2)




PAT - Angle Ranking (Section 3)














AADSAS – The Primary Application System


Personal Statement - Advice from ADEA

- Explain why you desire to pursue dental education in approx one page
 - Limit to 5,200 characters, including spaces
 - You may not go back and edit what you submit so it I recommended to prepare outside of the application in a word processing program prior to uploading and submitting
- Admissions Committee members are looking for individuals who are:
 - Motivated
 - Academically prepared
 - Articulate
 - Socially conscious
 - Knowledgeable about the profession



Personal Statement - My Advice

- Answer the question being asked
- Use correct grammar and use a spell checker
- Use concrete supporting examples, which tell how you grew and learned
- Do not list what is in other areas of the application
- Make it meaningful to you and your audience
- Keep your writing simple, and organize it logically
- Have a couple of good proof readers at the most
- Be yourself but do not be too casual
- REVISE! REVISE! REVISE!




Letters of Evaluation (LOE)


- Determine where you'll need your letters from ahead of time:
 - Some school's req: 1 Dentist, 2 Science Faculty, 1 Researcher, 1 spiritual advisor...
- Develop relationships with potential writers
- Ask for a GOOD recommendation letter
- No when to ask someone else



Letters of Evaluation - Interfolio



Interfolio improves productivity throughout the scholarly lifecycle.



- A letter Service where
 Letters of Evaluation may be uploaded as an alternative to going through the AADSAS
- Advantage: You many have your letters ready to submit before the AADSAS opens.

- Supplemental Applications
- Interview
- Thank you Letters
- Accepting Offers

Supplemental (Secondary) Applications



- Requirements are specific to the school
- Usually involves request for additional information and essays
- Supplemental Essays: should follow rules for the Personal Statement

• Important!! Do NOT copy and paste from your primary to your supplemental. Rewrite everything, even if the same question is asked

Interviewing – Attire recommendations

- Dress business professional
- Have your clothes dry cleaned
- Nothing too different
- No perfume or cologne
- Bring floss to use before your interview
- Important!!: Now is not the time to stand out from the crowd!!!
 You did this in your application, which is why you are at the interview.



- Traditional to consider
 - Black or Navy Suit, Jacket, and tie
 - Skirts to the knees
 - Pants not sagging low
 - Shirts not short
 - Shoes should match the belt
 - Hair and nails groomed
 - Close toed shoes, no big heals

Interviewing - Preparation

- Review your application
- Read up on the Schools
- Make a list of questions
- Practice answering interview questions
- Prepare for a writing sample



You are almost there! Don't quit now!

Interviewing - Nail It!

- Shake hands
- Make eye contact
- Do not to cut off the interviewer
- Ask for clarification
- Answer the question, concisely
- Smile!



• Enjoy the experience...You are at a Dental School Interview!!!

Thank You Letters

- Best sent soon after your interview, but there is no set time
- Completely optional



Accepting Offers

- First offers are given
- You must accept and pay a deposit sometimes within 15 to 30 days
- Deposits are usually NON-Refundable
- Schools have 1, 2, or even 3 deposits




Withdrawal Letters

- The application cycle closes
- If you hold more a position in multiple schools, you must decide
- You will be given a withdrawal deadline
- Before this date, you must notify any school with an open offer and let them know if you will or will not accept their offer.
- If you have more than one acceptance, you must decline your acceptance with all but one of these schools

• Important!! Some schools will just drop you if they see you have other offers at this point and you lose your spot


Timeline – Far In Advance (NOW!!)

- SAVE MONEY!!


